# Weeping, Joy, and Disaffiliation Update

For his anger is but for a moment; his favour is for a lifetime. Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning Psalm 30:5 NRSV

Hey Everyone! Thank you for following along with our updates in regards to disaffiliation. We are coming to the end of a very long road and there is immense joy arriving with us at our destination. However, the road has not been easy and emotions have run high at times as we have traveled together.

The psalmist wrote about many things in chapter 30 but specifically addresses two in the verse above. He addresses the emotion but then addresses the outcome we should expect as believers in response to that emotion. The first was anger. I think if we were honest with ourselves, we would admit that there have been times throughout the process where we may have felt a little anger. Anger is an emotion given by God, like many others, that helps us express how we feel and comprehend what's going on in our surroundings. To feel it is natural and to respond is at times necessary but used in the wrong way can be hurtful to those we love the most. While there have been times we may have felt angry, I think we would also agree that we have seen God's miraculous favor over the last several months as well. One example would be our final disaffiliation fee decreased another \$13,000 in the last two weeks. When we started two years ago, we thought the total cost would be over \$289,000 and now it's just under \$83,000. Even though His favor is not often financial I yelled for joy when it manifested in the final agreement with the South Georgia Annual Conference of the UMC! This is only one example of many other good things that are taking place within and outside the walls of the church where we can see his sovereign favor manifest in our community. Yes, there is anger but it's only for a moment. The psalmist writes that If we see past the anger and embrace His will/our calling we will experience His favor for a lifetime.

The second was about weeping. I've talked to a lot of people over the past few months. Most in our church and countless outside of our church as well. While there has been anger for only a few, the most prominent emotion has been weeping or as some translations put it; sorrow. There is a sadness when we think about leaving something we have been a part of and lived in for so long. I would be a liar to say I didn't have the feeling of sadness about some of our changes. I'm sad to think of not going to annual conferences, some of the clergy gatherings, and leaving behind years of labor of love. I've wept over changes made and people who have been hurt or displaced in so many churches around South Georgia, even in our own context in Centerville. There is a loss that feels as if we are experiencing the death of a dear friend. Weeping, like anger, is also natural and requires a response in order to grieve and move forward. The writer writes to the reader that sorrow, although painful, lasts for a short time. New days are coming, and there they will find Joy!

There are emotions but where's the update? The first two paragraphs of this week's newsletter/ update were pertinent to what we want to share with you today. I pray you go back and read the other updates as everything in matters of finance and the building are moving along in a timely manner and on schedule. Today we are focusing on opportunities to experience our emotions but to also live into God's favor and celebrate with Joy new mornings that are ahead.

May 21st will be unofficially our last Sunday as a United Methodist Church. That afternoon the Annual Conference will vote to approve disaffiliations of all the churches who have voted through their own church conferences to separate from the UMC. We will only have ONE SERVICE on this particular Sunday for a couple of different reasons. One, is to love one another as we remember all the work that has been done in our congregation since our inception. God has blessed us in so many ways and will continue to as we become The Well at Centerville. But to say there will not be sadness and even anger is hubris. It's ok, and as the body we will experience this together and pray with one another through it. The second is for us to gather together for a time of prayer and to remember that even though we may feel our sorrow and even weep that there is a


