Sacrament of Holy Communion: A Profound Means of Grace

Hey Church!

Thank you so much for allowing us this opportunity to take a few days off to rest and recuperate as a family. We are grateful for you and for those who served while we were away. I'm sure Brandon gave a great word to you on Sunday. I know you were blessed by his wisdom and passion on this particular means of grace. We spoke about this series several months ago when I planned to be out of town. When I asked him to preach and shared the sermon title, he lit up with joy. When that happens, you know the right person was there at the right time. I'm grateful for how God works that way when we need it and grateful for all of you while we are away.

The sacrament of Holy Communion holds a significant place in Christian traditions worldwide, as it is considered a powerful means of grace. Let's look at the importance, philosophy, and beauty of this sacred practice.

At its core, Holy Communion represents the commemoration and celebration of the Last Supper, where Jesus Christ shared bread and wine with His disciples, instructing them to do the same in remembrance of Him. 




