Something in a Name

Several years ago I had the pleasure of meeting a man in my local church named Jack. Every Sunday Jack would bring Dum Dum suckers for all the kids at church. Every week, just before service started, you could see the kids flock to Mr. Jack for their morning sugar rush! One particular Sunday he was running late to church and everyone was concerned. He was 92 years old but he didn't miss and he always answered his phone. When he finally arrived we found out he had been pulled over by the Georgia State Patrol and was very frustrated by the predicament. He explained that he was indeed speeding but for good reason; he forgot the kid's candy at his house and had turned around. The officer just wouldn't understand his reasoning for excessive speeds and still wrote the ticket.

I grew to know Jack over the course of several years and had the blessing of knowing some of his family as well. They loved him very much and he had built a life worth living from small and humble beginnings. He had already lost his beloved bride, his oldest son, and would unknowingly lose another within a few years. Through it all he maintained his faith and love for God. On one particular visit, I asked Jack "What does it mean to be a man?" I've learned over the years that some questions, no matter how elementary, need to be asked of some people because of life's experiences and Jack had more experiences than most people have in two lifetimes. I'll never forget his response. With tears in his eyes, he said "It's your name". He went on to explain that years earlier when he was a much younger man, another gentleman in town had the exact same name but with one letter changed. But unless you knew both men their names could be used interchangeably. He said that this was frustrating. He was working hard to raise his family, build a business, and serve the community. The other barely participated in life and only worked to benefit himself. Even though there was only one letter difference the impact of the other Jack's actions would often cause our Jack headache and frustration. No matter what though, Jack maintained his integrity through the good, bad, and other Jack.

It was a pleasure to participate in Jack's service when he passed. Months earlier we honored his Son in life and I spoke to him in person for the last time. He was much older and really didn't understand all the events taking place but there was a part of the man I once knew still there. I remembered my question to Jack just a couple of years before. My takeaway from his life is that one letter truly does make a difference. People lined the church at his service; it was standing room only as we honored the real Jack in that small community. A life lived, life given, and life received in eternity. Life well lived.

Studying Paul reminds me a lot of Jack and how one letter can make all the difference. Saul became Paul so that people would know who he was in Christ as much as who he was as a Roman. It may have been only one letter but it's one that made all the difference. I would ask you this week as you read, to ask yourself what would make the difference for you? Maybe it's a small change that doesn't require a different name. Maybe a change of heart or an ask for forgiveness. Whatever it is I pray God give you the strength to remember that wherever you are and wherever you've been His name matters more than our own. We are who He makes us to be if we are willing. Jack and Paul didn't fulfill their obligations in life because of their own name but because of the name of Jesus.

➤ Workers are needed in the Clothes Closet on Mondays and Tuesdays from 9a-12 noon.


Church Apparel




