Procrastination

Luke 12:40

40 You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

Some people are gifted with special talents they display for everyone to see. They may be artistic, musically inclined, or capable of physical feats others wouldn't dream of. Now I always felt God had blessed me with a special talent, but my mother disagreed. I thought it was just her and her inability to see a gift this wonderful, but I was amazed to learn my wife didn't see my special talent either. Both of these people, of whom I've lived closely with my entire life, couldn't see the hidden gem I had somehow undoubtedly unlocked, like Superman developing his powers for the first time. What was my superpower, you might ask? Procrastination!

That's right it is a gift that keeps on giving. It gives life excitement and flare even in the mundane things. What good is a school project due date if you are done a week in advance. Noooo! The night before a science project is due is the perfect time to build an exploding volcano. Better yet, why buy Christmas presents months in advance when you can feel the rush of whether or not the store will have the only present your precious bride asked for this year? I am proud to say I've passed this gene on to my own children as day in and day out they wait until the last minute to tell us about school events and parties. The excitement of trying to buy a gift on the way to the event keeps us on our toes and makes us feel alive!

I pray you can feel the sarcasm in the tone of this article. Katie is right and so was my mother, my procrastination is not a gift but a hindrance. It may feel exciting to wait until the last minute and I've often said that I work best under the pressure of procrastination, but unfortunately, it's also how someone ends up disappointed on Christmas morning. Disappointment and procrastination tend to go hand in hand that way; something will be missed, and someone will be disappointed because we were not able to accomplish the job or do it as well as we should have. The author of Luke writes about the danger of procrastination in chapter 2. He tells us to be ready because Jesus' return will be unexpected and if we are not ready, we will be surely disappointed in the outcome.

Love cannot wait, patience cannot wait, forgiveness cannot wait; especially during the holidays. We need to be proactive in these things and not wait until the last minute. The gift is not as special if we withhold the giving or wait until the last minute. We don't know the day, or the hour Jesus will return or our life will simply end. Therefore, there is no gift in our procrastination, only disappointment. Love today, give today, pray today, encourage today; for some these things cannot wait for us to procrastinate.


Community Missions
