Sunday, December 10, 2023 ~ Second Sunday in Advent

"The mass of men lead lives of quiet desperation" -Henry David Thoreau

- 1 Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me, for in you my soul takes refuge; in the shadow of your wings I will take refuge, until the destroying storms pass by.
- 2 I cry to God Most High, to God who fulfills his purpose for me.
- 3 He will send from heaven and save me, he will put to shame those who trample on me. Selah God will send forth his steadfast love and his faithfulness. -Psalm 57:1-3

I've been thinking about this Thoreau quote a lot lately. "The mass of men lead lives of quiet desperation". There is a hunger at times for some that can not be tamed; a thirst that can not be satisfied by their normal day to day routines. It's not to say this is a bad thing, routine and such, but it is to say that some have a longing and desire for more than to slowly navigate from birth to death. They are caged like an animal, built to accomplish more and to achieve more than a crowd at a traveling circus exhibit.

Our initial reaction for these types is to say they stretch too far or ask too much; "be satisfied" or in church vernacular "be content". Then we turn the pages of our scriptures and read of the birth of a baby boy who lived his life beyond the quiet desperation of those around him. We are then called to ask what if Jesus had been satisfied or content? What if he would have settled for normal and refused to follow his purpose? What Christmas would we celebrate then?

No, the world needs Jesus and people like him who do not settle for the status quo and find a purpose beyond their own individuality. Their purpose is rooted in the greater good or the belief in the people around them of whom God placed in their lives at that specific moment and time. They find joy and happiness in trying something new and working to achieve a goal that others may say is impossible. The Wright Brothers, astronauts, ultra marathon runners, and professional bass fishermen; ok, I stretched the last one just a little bit! They all have a longing and desire for the atypical and abnormal.

The psalmist writes about God's love, mercy, and protection but he also writes about God's fulfillment of his purpose. When we have a clear sense of our purpose as Jesus did it doesn't mean there isn't fear or worry. Those are guaranteed, but what is also guaranteed is that we can find refuge, we will be saved, and we see His faithfulness in all we do. He is boldly calling us to His purpose in him. We can fly when others say it's impossible, grow when some say it can't be done, run where others haven't, and follow in the footsteps of Jesus with boldness. We are people called to purpose in this season of Advent, not bound by the silence of quiet desperation.


Community Missions


