Innovate or Go Home!

There I was listening to a podcast I found a few months earlier. It was a hunting podcast that produced an episode a week and I followed it religiously. The episode that premiered that day was a little different as it was an interview with a nationally recognized sales rep discussing the topic of innovation. I'll never forget the statement he made and what became the title for that episode; "Innovate or go home!". The message was twofold, innovate or get out of the way but also if you don't innovate you will go home because there won't be any work to do because your business will be closed. The content rang a bell in my heart, and I listened to that episode 4 times over the next week. (It was two hours long!). I thought about the implications of this message as it applies to my own context in the church and found the same truth. We must choose to innovate, or we will go home.

Now, when we are talking about innovation, we're not necessarily discussing changing the product itself. We're not trying to change Jesus nor should we. Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. He is Good, Loving, Kind, Gracious, and Sovereign. While He is all these things the way we have presented the Gospel has changed dramatically over the years. The early church was filled with innovation starting in the Upper Room. The Disciples were given the gift of the Holy Spirit, and it says that they began speaking in other languages. This is the message at its' core! God will provide the means if we are willing to be the delivery system. The why was important, not the how.

We often get stuck in this conundrum of making the how more important than the why. I've found this to be true in business and in the business of the church. We often think that we can continue to do the same things over and over again when it doesn't work, and we will get a different result. This is the very definition of insanity. Unfortunately, there are things changing within church culture that will never be the same. That is also something we can't change. However, we can change how we share the good news of Christ in a way that speaks to every person no matter their language, age, or station in life. God gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit not just to help ourselves but to help us innovatively speak to those who we might not understand or, for that matter, may not understand us. When we are a willing vessel guided by the Holy Spirit our why takes priority over the how, opening the doors for innovation and practical applications of the Gospel and Church. We are then left with the choice; we can innovate or go home.

2 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3 Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.




