- 7. When I can laugh at myself, I am more effective in ministry.
- 8. I learned to be more compassionate through the deaths of my parents and grandson. I can now understand the pain many experience.
- 9. I am always hurt when I hold grudges.
- 10. I need to ask for forgiveness more quickly.
- 11. I need friends to share both the joys and the challenges of ministry.
- 12. I wish my sons had not seen my frustrations when I was a pastor or a dad or a husband.
- 13. Life is short. Live it totally for Him every moment.
- 14. I should stand stronger for injustice.
- 15. Some of my most miserable days came when I grew jealous of others in ministry.
- 16. Some other miserable days came when I lived to please people rather than God.
- 17. When I don't take care of myself physically, ministry seems more of a burden than a iov.
- 18. Children are young but for a season. Some of my greatest joys have been with my three sons.
- 19. One of the greatest blessings of life is to have adult children who are my best friends.
- 20. I'm not nearly as smart as I sometimes think I am.
- 21. I've never seen an argument won on social media.
- 22. The local church is the best imperfect place on earth.
- 23. I am always wiser when I listen to the wisdom of others.
- 24. Too often, I list my problems rather than count my blessings.

### Women at the Well


